This work will be participant-centered. Our role will be to help you bring together the principles of Universal Design for Learning and Understanding by Design to create units that are inclusive, affirming, and relevant for all learners. Integrating <u>The New Jim Crow: Mass Incarceration in the Age of Colorblindness</u> into the curriculum

5 to 7 Teachers from across the TST BOCES region are invited to participate in this project. This group of teachers will work together, with facilitation from the TST BOCES School Improvement Services team, to either plan a unit with the New Jim Crow as an anchor text, or to build the text and its core ideas into current units the teachers have already created. Teachers will earn a stipend of \$250.00 for completion of this project. Expectations include:

- Reading of the full text and participation in a facilitated discussion of the text.
- Three-days of facilitated work time with TST BOCES Instructional Specialists and/or Assistant Superintendent for Instruction
 in July/August 2017 to get started on the project, utilizing the principles of Understanding by Design (<u>UbD</u>) and Universal
 Design for Learning (<u>UDL</u>)
- Completion of a full unit plan, or integration of the text into multiple unit plans, prior to the end of August, 2017.
- Teaching the unit during the 2017 2018 school year.
- Reflection with TST BOCES Instructional Specialists and/or Assistant Superintendent for Instruction on the ways in which
 the delivery of the unit/units matched the intended student outcomes, and the ways in which the unit/units might be revised
 to improve these outcomes.

Balancing Math Instruction with Technology: The Potential of Zearn

Zearn Math is a complete math program that provides standards aligned math lessons, supports individual learning, and is based on Eureka Math / Engage New York. Lessons focus on three critical components: deep understanding, fluency, and problem-solving. With Zearn Math, students learn new concepts in two ways: through Independent Digital Lessons and Small Group Instruction with their teacher. In this professional learning opportunity, participants will gain foundational knowledge of how to balance their daily instruction of the Eureka Math / Engage New York curriculum with the interactive Zearn platform. Participants will experience a structured math lesson from the student perspective, using hands-on manipulatives and teacher guided instruction connected with the related independent Zearn tasks. Participants will also consider Zearn data reports to analyze student learning and make instructional recommendations. The Excelsior Scholarship, Making College Possible

Earlier this year, Governor Cuomo and the State Legislature enacted the Excelsior Scholarship program, which is administered by the Higher Education Services Corporation. The following information is provided by the Governor's office about the program's application, which is now available. "The Excelsior Scholarship makes New York State public universities tuition-free for families making up to \$125,000 per year once fully phased in. The scholarship is available to students attending a SUNY or CUNY school starting this fall whose families make up to \$100,000. The Excelsior Scholarship application is now available on the Higher Education Services Corporation website. The application is open until July 21.
