The Assessment and Remediation Guide "is intended for use with students who have mastered some or most of the letter-sound correspondences in the English language, but who are not yet fluent readers because they lack specific decoding skills, and/or have not had sufficient practice in reading decodable text." This workshop will focus on administering the Placement Assessments, understanding the basic and advanced code in CKLA, developing intervention lessons using the explicit instruction template, and using corresponding instructional and progress monitoring materials for each section of the guide.
